# A Little of Closebourne Village's History.....

October 8th is the 10th anniversary of the Official Opening of Morpeth House as our Community Centre along with the Swimming Pool and Gym.

Until 8th October2014 the only facility that was available to the residents was the Chapel, which had been repurposed and handed over to the Residents in February 2012. The first residents had started to move into their Villas in June 2011, when there was no facilities and no sealed roads.

Morpeth House had been in a very sad state, before it was completely refurbished. Some of the doors and much of the floor were rotted out due to numerous leaks. Falls through the floor (by staff and workman) happened several times during the planning stages. The building had not been occupied since 2006 and fenced off from the residents until the official opening.

The Office was originally in Closebourne House before it was relocated to Villa 102 and then to Morpeth House in 2014.
